Muk Muk - Liam & Dottie



We're excited to share the story behind our House name, Muk Muk. 'Muk Muk' is a Woiwurrung word that means 'owl.'

You will see our House design on the school mural, painted by Uncle Brendan Kennedy. In First Nations culture, owls are often seen as symbols of wisdom, guidance, and protection. They are believed to carry messages and watch over the land.

As part of Muk Muk House, we can show the same wisdom and care by thinking before we act, supporting our friends, and always striving to do our best. Our Muk Muk house is represented by the colour Yellow!



Marram - Emily and Johnny

I'm excited to share the story behind our House name, Marram. 'Marram' is a Woiwurrung word that means 'kangaroo.' The Woiwurrung people are the Traditional Owners of this land, the Wurundjeri people of the Kulin Nation.

Our House symbol comes from the amazing mural at our school, painted by Uncle Brendan Kennedy, a respected Indigenous artist. His artwork helps tell the story of the land, the animals, and the people who have lived here for thousands of years.

Kangaroos are strong, fast, and always move forward. As part

of Marram House, we can show the same strength and teamwork by supporting each other—just like a family of kangaroos! Our Marram house is represented by the colour Red!

Bundabun - Maddison & Trehy

Bunjil House

We're excited to share the story behind our House name, Bundabun. 'Bundabun' is a Woiwurrung word that means 'turtle.'

You will see our House design on the school mural. In First Nation's culture, turtles are often seen as symbols of wisdom, protection, and connection to water and Country. They remind us to be patient, strong, and to keep moving forward.

As part of Bundabun House, we can show the same determination and care by working hard and supporting each other—just like turtles! Our Bundabun house is represented by the colour Green!

Let's talk about the story behind our House name, Bunjil. 'Bunjil' is a Woiwurrung word that means 'eagle.'

You will see our House design on the school mural. In First Nations culture, Bunjil the eagle is a powerful creator spirit and a protector of the land and its people. He represents leadership, strength, and wisdom.

As part of Bunjil House, we can show the same leadership and courage by setting a good example, working together, and always aiming high. Our Bunjil house is represented by the colour Blue!

WHOLE SCHOOL ATHLETICS DAY - WEDNESDAY MARCH 5th

Our student leaders and House Captains will be busy on Wednesday the 5th of March when we hold our whole school athletics day in Coburg.

This is an exciting school event and we encourage all families who can attend to embrace the House name and colour of the family, come on down, and support the students.



UNSAFE PARKING, DRIVING, AND MISUSE OF DESIGNATED AND <u>CLEARLY</u>SIGNED DROP-OFF/PICK-UP AREAS AROUND THE SCHOOL



The ongoing disregard for basic road safety and the lack of respect for fellow road users by some members of our school community is deeply frustrating. This behavior is causing tension among community members and creating an unsafe environment for our students.

I have already requested the City of Darebin to increase their presence around the school during drop-off and pick-up times, and I've also reached out to local police to have a presence in the area.

Unlike many other areas in Darebin, there is ample on-street parking around our school. Therefore, there is no need for the unsafe behavior currently being exhibited.

Parking for more than two minutes in the KISS & GO areas, or leaving your car unattended during the hours of 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM and 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM, is not acceptable. This behavior contributes to dangerous congestion and an unsafe environment for everyone.

Parking in any signed NO PARKING / NO STANDING zones near school crossings is also prohibited, as it obstructs the view of crossing supervisors and creates additional hazards for students and families.

Parking in bus zones is equally unacceptable as it causes dangerous congestion on the roads.

Finally, attempting to perform a 5-point U-turn in the driveways of community members or across street crossings on Hickford St and St Vigeons Rd is not only unacceptable but also extremely dangerous.






