Dear Reservoir Views students, families and local community members,

Throughout the week we have been celebrating the cultural diversity of our wonderful community and we are looking forward to our Harmony Day open session tomorrow from **9am to 11am**. Students and families are encouraged to wear cultural clothing or any orange clothing/splash of orange. Wearing orange encourages people to come together, embrace different cultures, and promote a sense of belonging for everyone, regardless of their background.

Did you know that there are 28 different languages spoken within our school community? One of these languages is Dutch, spoken by our amazing Foundation teacher Hasse. In the spirit of cultural diversity week, I have been utilising Hasse's fluency in reading, writing, and speaking Dutch to translate a Dutch newspaper

article from 1953 about my Dutch great, great-grandfather Anton Hoogen. A family member recently found the newspaper article and it sheds new light on why Anton immigrated to Melbourne in 1882; he deserted Germany, where he was living with his family, to avoid being conscripted to German military service. Wearing orange tomorrow will have a double meaning as it is the national colour of the Netherlands.

Tomorrow is also National Ride to School Day and I know each year we are breaking records for the number of students and staff who ride, skate, scoot, rollerblade, and even roller skate to school!







RESERVOIR VIEWS PRIMARY SCHOOL KINDERGARTEN

I have been involved in countless meetings with the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA), architects, and other stakeholders since it was announced last year that our school would be receiving a kindergarten. I am still waiting for official communication from the VSBA to share with our community, but I can share this information that was updated on the VSBA website

The playground and shade structure will be relocated further south of the playing field, the sheds will be shifted and the running track and netball court will not be affected.

This is an exciting addition to our school, and I will keep our community updated on the building's progress throughout the year.

NEW RELOCATABLE BUILDING

Temporary fencing was erected today in preparation for the installation/delivery of a new portable for our school. This new space will be ready for use by the first day of Term 2 and will be the new home for 34B and 56C, Marina and Tegan's classes.

The temporary fencing does mean that we will have to move the classroom entry and exit point for 34D (Connie and Chay) and 34C (Jack), these classes will now enter and exit via the main entry to Building C.

The delivery of this building will increase the overall capacity of the school and provide two more dedicated teaching spaces.

The entire school had an amazing time participating in our Whole School Athletics Day!






























