Dear Reservoir Views students, families and local community members,

The three days last week when all students were finally back at school full time was lovely; happy kids, happy families and staff.

I was talking to one of our parents on Friday about the possibility of Reservoir Views being affected by a Covid-19 case and that it is not a matter of *if* but *when*. Unfortunately that *when* came the next day when I was notified of a confirmed case at school. I would like to thank the family for notifying the school so promptly, this meant I was able to complete all the necessary actions required of me over the weekend and our school did not have to close for any period of time.

Unfortunately it does mean that a number of our students and staff have been identified as Primary Close Contacts and they are currently quarantining at home. For staff and students who are double vaccinated, the quarantine period is 7 days and for everyone else it is 14 days. These students have resumed remote learning. I know this is extremely deflating for everyone, especially the students, that they are remote learning after finally coming back to school.

This is another challenge for us to navigate as a community. I can only stress that if your child has any symptoms of Covid-19, the slightest of these symptoms, which include:

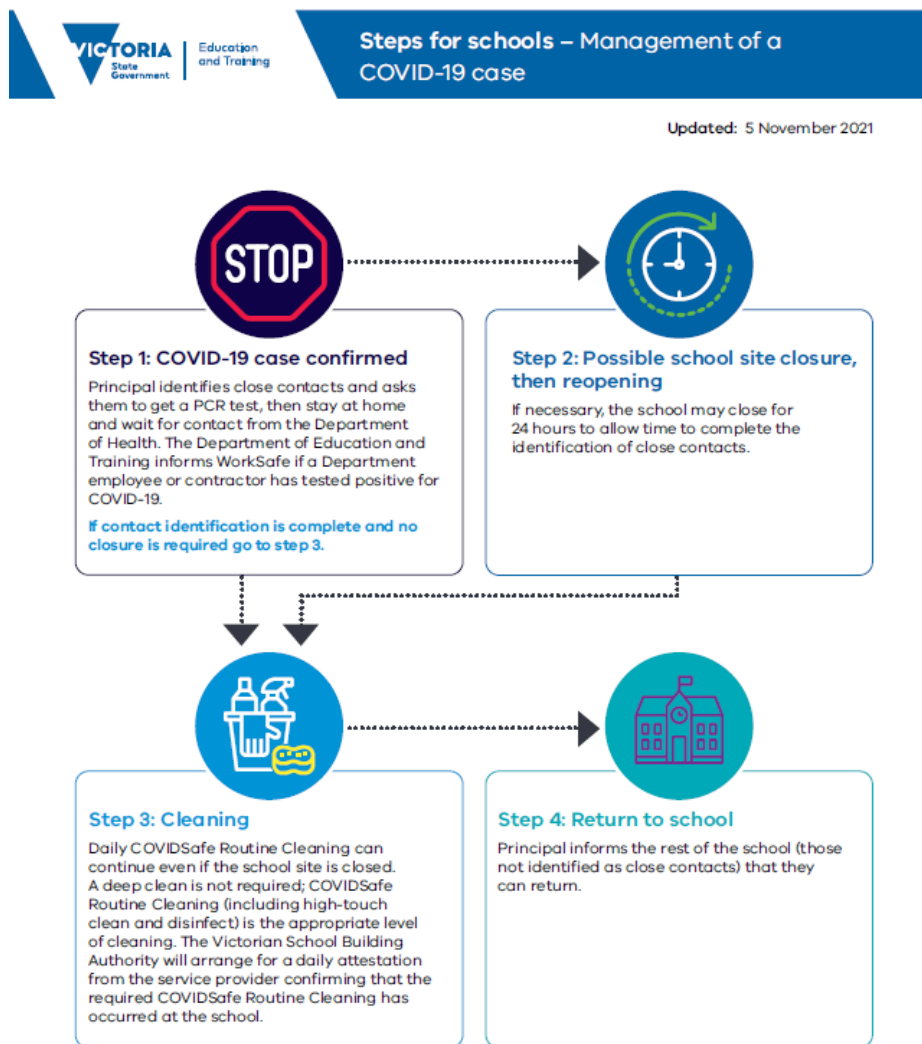
- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat

- shortness of breath
- runny nose
- loss or change in sense of smell or taste.
- Headache
- muscle soreness
- stuffy nose
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- diarrhea

Please keep them at home and get tested as soon as possible and isolate them at home until you receive a negative test result. We require evidence of this negative test result before your child can return to school.

We are contacting families of students who present with any of these symptoms at school and diligently following health protocols; we are requesting students be collected as soon as possible, that they receive a PCR test as soon as possible and they are only allowed to return to school when they are feeling better and we have evidence of a negative test result.

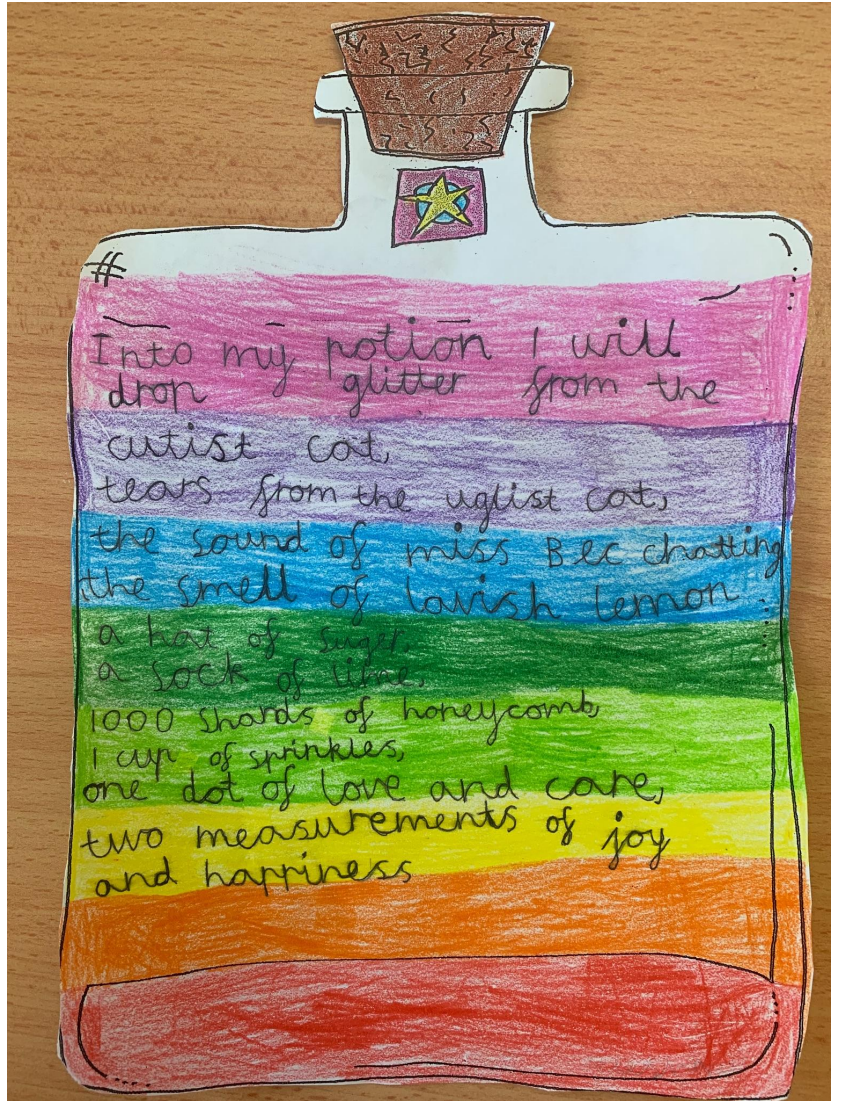
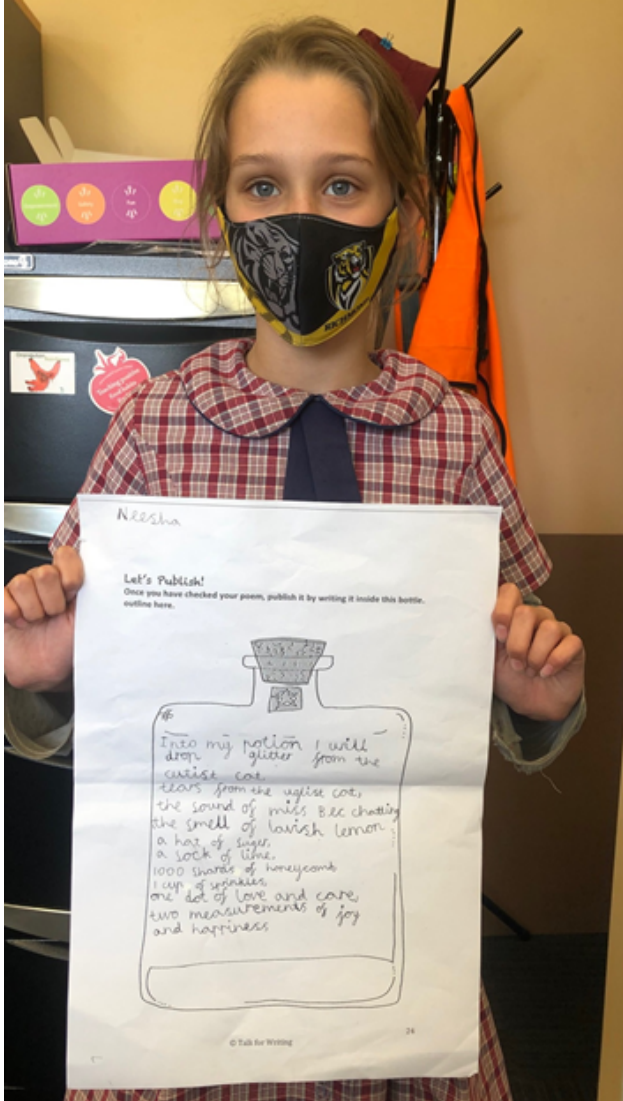
Below is an infographic that shows the steps for schools to manage a Covid-19 case.

CLASS STRUCTURE FOR 2022

After much deliberation and modelling of possible class structures for 2022, our Consultative Committee unanimously decided on the following structure for 2022.

Our projected total enrolment is 220 students across 10 classes. This number will fluctuate before the first school day of 2022.

This model was selected as it ensures we maintain small classroom sizes within years Foundation to Year 2.

The colours show the teaching team composition. The next steps for us now are allocating students and teachers to these classes.

2022 GRADE ALLOCATION

We are currently organising our 2022 grades. Throughout this process, we aim: to provide each student to be part of a class that will allow the best opportunity to learn, to form well-balanced classes that take into account the social, emotional, academic and physical characteristics of each student and to ensure that optimum use is made of the prior knowledge that teachers, parents and relevant others have of each student prior to class placement.

Students will be asked either this week or next to nominate peers within their cohort level who they *work well with*. We recognise the importance of fostering and maintaining friendship groups. We also understand that it is equally important for students to mix and learn with peers who have different interests.

Parents may submit written requests with respect to class placements. The submissions must be based only on educational reasons and in writing to me by the morning of Friday the 19th of November. All written parent submissions will be given consideration but will not automatically be accommodated. The allocation of students to various classes, class structures, teaching responsibilities and class compositions are all ultimately responsibilities of the Principal.

While the allocation of students to various classes, class structures and class sizes are all ultimately responsibilities of the Principal, a collaborative process with teachers and parents/carers will be employed.

The process:

- In November, the Principal will invite parents/carers via the Newsletter, to put in writing to the Principal, particular requests, of student welfare or academic nature, regarding the placement of their student. *These requests will only be considered if they are submitted by the due date as communicated in the Newsletter/Compass. These requests will be considered but no guarantee is given, the Principal has the final decision for the placement of students in classes.*
- The process of forming classes for the following year will commence in November.
- Expressions of interest for teaching preferences will be sought from staff members.
- Staff members will work collaboratively to create draft classes of students.
- When forming classes, consideration will be given to a balance of gender, student's previous class, each student's ability, behaviour and friendship groups. Individual student needs and a whole school perspective will also be considered.
- Once draft classes are completed, the Principal will make any final alterations, in consultation with Year Level Leaders and the Assistant Principal.
- The composition of proposed classes will not be disclosed to students or parents/carers prior to any formal announcements.
- Details relating to the school organisation, class allocation of students and the roles of teachers will be announced on the day of the final 'step up' transition session. The school will not publish class lists to protect the privacy of all students. The students are responsible for communicating their new class with their parents/carers.
- Once classes have been announced, any parents/carers seeking clarification regarding student placement are asked to speak with the Principal or Assistant Principal.
- Changes to the class allocation for students will be avoided unless determined by the Principal. Parents/carers were given the opportunity to provide input during November, therefore any requests for changes to a student's class allocation will not be considered after the formal announcement.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Dear Reservoir Views students and family members,

Childhood and adolescence can be a difficult and challenging time for some students.

Fortunately, school support staff are in a position to help students deal with these challenges by linking them to specialist staff on school grounds.

OnPsych services are now available at **Reservoir Views PS** onPsych offer services to students and their families at no cost under the GP Health Plan. This will entitle the student/family member to a maximum of 10 sessions per year with the psychologist.

The onPsych staff member who is working at **Reservoir Views PS** is named **Clara Lee**. To ensure there is no waiting period for your child, I encourage you to follow these easy steps to obtain a GP referral and fax this directly to onPsych as soon as possible:

- Complete the paperwork below (titled 'Information for your GP')
- Book a double appointment with your GP
- Advise them of your concerns regarding your child's emotional wellbeing
- Obtain a referral under the Better Access Initiative (Item 2715/2700)
- Bring the referral and the paperwork directly back to school and pass it to Hayriye
- **Clara** will then be in contact with you to arrange a meeting for yourself and your child.

We've had a lovely few weeks being back at school! Ms. Lou and Mr. Dylan say they are so impressed with how well we've transitioned back to onsite learning. We've only needed a few reminders with some routines but for the most part it's like riding a bike - and the more we practise the better we get! We've been eager to see our friends and have spent lots of time catching up, playing, and working together.

We have been learning about new sounds to read words with complex sounds (split digraphs in words like 'l-i-k-e' where the 'i_e' digraph gets split up) and continue practising strategies to read and write with greater independence. We've been refreshing maths concepts explored across the year like addition and subtraction, patterns, 2D shapes and 3D objects, and capacity. Our teachers regularly compliment us for our efforts and focus!

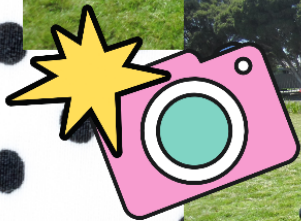
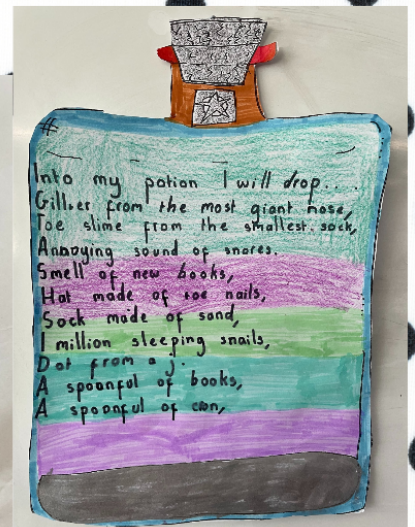
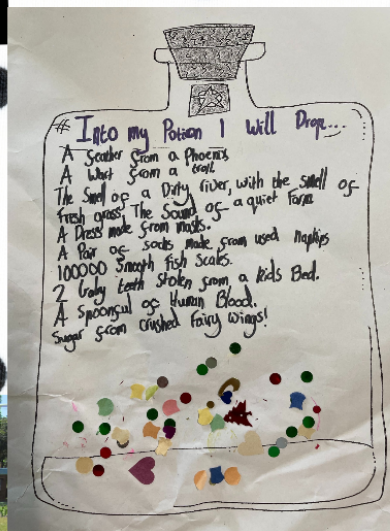

During writing sessions students have been learning how to use persuasive language and adjectives to enhance their writing. Students enjoyed creating their own 'potions'.

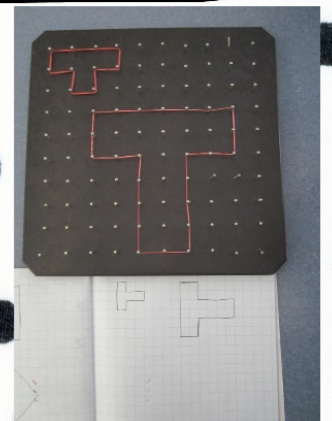
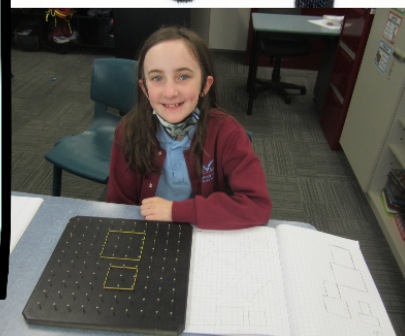


Maths

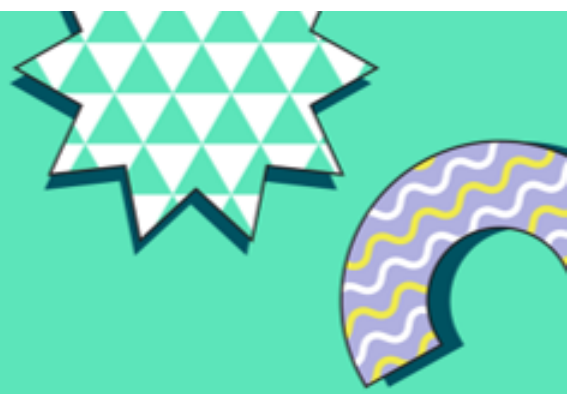
