Unfortunately the provider has had to change the date for our next vaccination clinic at Reservoir Views. The new date is Thursday the 29th of April. This is the first week of term 2. It will be held in the art room from 3:30pm to 6:30pm.

#### OCTOPUS SCHOOL - RAISED CROSSING AT HICKFORD ST & BANFF ST

I have just received notification from Darebin City Council that a construction of a raised crossing area to Hickford St and Banff St will commence over the term break.

The works aim to improve pedestrian safety and focus on streetscape and footpath improvements. These works will include raised concrete pavement and ramps across Banff St, footpath and kerb and channel reconstruction and road pavement marking and signage. Construction is scheduled to commence on the 11th of April and is expected to be completed within 10 days. There will be a full road closure at the intersection of Hickford and Banff during construction.

Reservoir Views Primary School was selected as the third City of Darebin *Octopus School* in 2020. The Octopus School program aims to create a 'safe school precinct' for increasing the number of students walking and cycling to and from school.

I welcome this improvement to this intersection.

I hope that everyone has a very safe, enjoyable and relaxing break with their families. I look forward to seeing everyone on the first day of Term 2, Tuesday the 26th of April.



## CRISP RADISH & SPINACH SALAD

#### INGREDIENTS

- 3 TABLESPOONS OLIVE OIL
- 2 TABLESPOONS RED WINE VINEGAR
- 2 TEASPOONS HONEY
- 1 TEASPOON FRESH THYME LEAVES
- SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE
- 150 GRAMS BABY SPINACH
- 1 CUP THINLY SLICED RADISHES
- 100 GRAMS FETA, CUBED

In a large bowl, combine the olive oil, vinegar, honey, thyme, and salt and pepper.
Add the spinach and radishes to the bowl, and lightly toss.
Add the feta cubes, and gently toss again.
