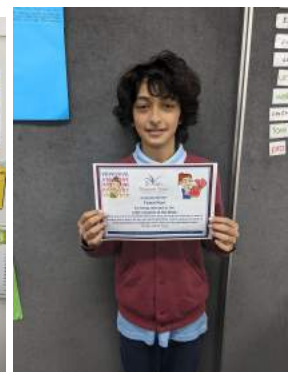
# SUNSMART - HATS and SUNSCREEN

## 2022 PARENT/CAREGIVER/GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. We encourage all families to participate in this survey. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> August to Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

## NUMERACY

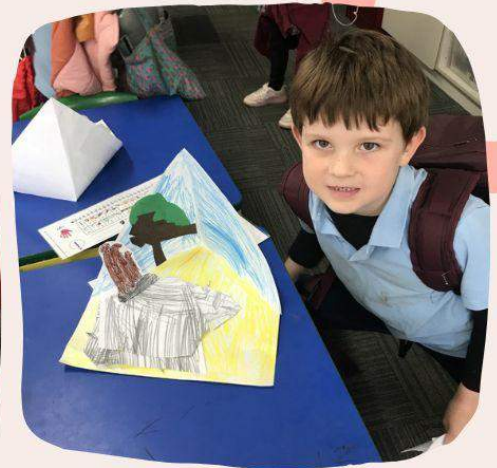
This fortnight, Foundation students have been using a variety of strategies to show their addition and subtraction knowledge. We can use materials, a ten frame and counters, draw a picture and use a number line to work out problems. Then write a number sentence about it.

## LITERACY

Language Comprehension - we have read some lovely Book Week books and explored some new vocabulary such as rollicking, clumsy, quivering and elegant.

Phonics - we are noticing the difference between the /f/ sound and the unvoiced /th/ sound. We have also, been learning when to use a c, k or ck when we hear a /k/ sound.

Writing - we have been working hard on what is needed for a complete sentence and re-reading our writing.



## INQUIRY

In our Inquiry unit we are investigating the needs of living things. We have been learning about different animal habitats. Each student chose an animal to research. We made triorama habitats for our animals.

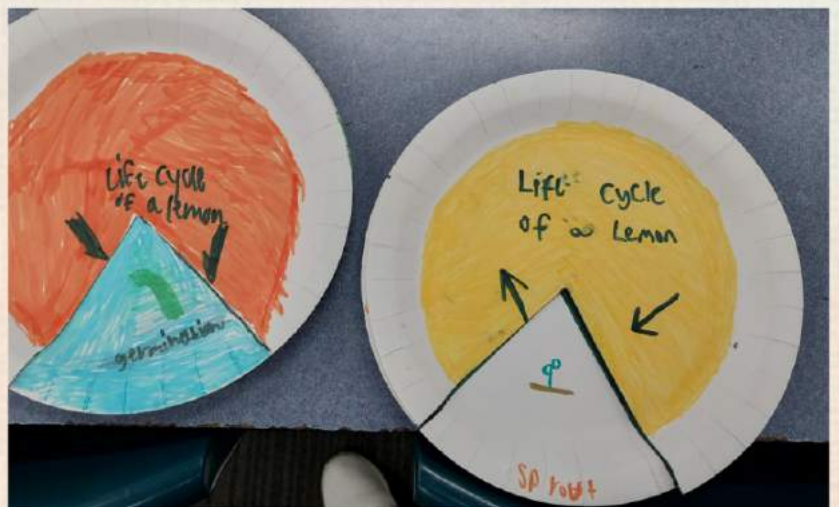
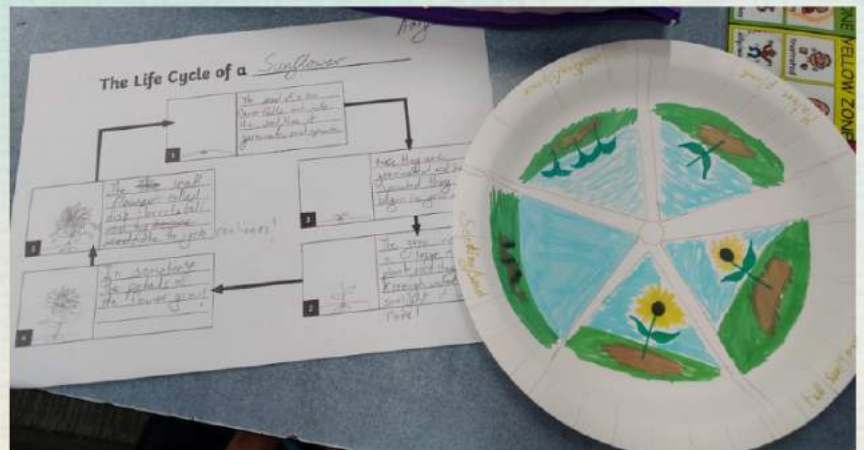

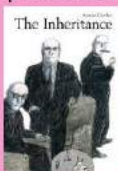
### Debating

### Reading

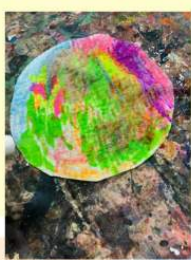
In class, we celebrated book week by reading the shortlisted picture story book 'The Inheritance' by Armin Greder. Students investigated the complex themes of greed and capitalism.
