#### ISAIAH FIREBRACE 'S VISIT TO RESERVOIR VIEWS

On Tuesday, Aboriginal musician (and star) Isaiah Firebrace ran a workshop with students in grade 3 to 6. Isaiah talked about his story and journey to where he is today, focusing on conquering his fears and resilience - bouncing back when the going gets tough. The students also performed his new song 'Spirit' with him. This is in preparation for Darebin City Council's 'Everyone's Voice' event on Sunday the 1st of September. 'Everyone's Voice' is a new annual event on the Darebin calendar, to recognise and celebrate First Nations peoples and the wider Darebin community.

All of our Grade 3 to 6 students are invited to sing with Isaiah at this special event. Darebin City Council would like the children to arrive at 11.00am for a rehearsal prior to the event start.

The program is hosted by Uncle Jack Charles and will feature a Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Welcome Ceremony with performances by the Djirri Djirri Dance Group and local primary school students, followed by a live music program headlined by Isaiah Firebrace.

This free event is for the entire Darebin community. Sunday 1st September from 12.00pm to 3.30pm, Darebin Arts Centre and Ray Bramham Gardens, Cnr Bell Street and St Georges Road, Preston.

Scouts



# 3/4 CERES EXCURSION





On the 21st of August 2019, grade 3-4 students went to CERES community environmental park to learn about sustainability. We were split in two groups. Each group participated in four different activities. The activities included were; waste timeline, paper making, Merricreek walk and the life cyle of a plant. We learnt lots of interesting facts about the products and resources that we use and how long it takes for rubbish to decompose. We really enjoyed the experience we had at CERES.

#### Some intersting facts we want to share with you:

- Wombat poo can be made into paper
- Glass takes 10,000 years to biodegrade
- If you throw your food waste in landfill it produces methane and it attracts more heat in the earth
- Lettuce takes approximately 25 years to decompose in landfill
- CERES invention clears the river's rubbish waste.
