GRUB CLUB— Delicious Cauliflower Nuggets.

Below is a recipe Chad used with our Grub Club and the beautiful cauliflowers they grew. They even used the parsley they have grown!

Cauliflower Nuggets For Kids



Ingredients

- ½ head of cauliflower (250g), chopped
- 1 egg
- ¾ cup fresh multigrain or sourdough breadcrumbs
- 1 tsp dried parsley or thyme
- ½ tsp celery salt (optional)
- 1 cup grated cheese
- Tip: if making for older children or adults, try adding a few tablespoons of crumbled feta or haloumi

cheese at step 3. Method

Step 1

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Line a baking tray with baking paper -

Step 2

Steam the cauliflower for 5 minutes on the stovetop or in a Thermomix until tender. Drain thoroughly and use paper towel to blot away the excess water -

Step 3

In a food processor or Thermomix, combine the cauliflower, eggs, breadcrumbs, parsley or thyme, celery salt and grated cheese. Process for around 10 seconds or until the mixture combines. Add more breadcrumbs if the mixture is too runny -

Step 4

Take teaspoon-sized amounts of the mixture and use your hands to form into nuggets. Place on the baking tray and continue with the remaining mixture -

Step 5

Bake for around 10 minutes, turn the nuggets and bake for a further 10 minutes or until golden brown.

Step 6

Storage: freeze raw or cooked nuggets in a freezer proof bag for up to two months. -

Step 7

Tip: for extra crunch brush the nuggets with some melted butter or olive oil -


Growing Children, Thriving Children PARENTING TALK



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DOGS AT RESERVOIR VIEWS PRIMARY SCHOOL

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the rules and procedures we have in place in relation to dogs attending our school grounds.

POLICY

Assistance dogs

Reservoir Views Primary School understands its obligations under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cth) and the Equal Opportunity Act 2010 (Vic) and will make reasonable adjustments for members of our school community with a disability who require an 'assistance animal' to help alleviate the effects of their disability. Assistance animals are permitted to attend our school with their handler. Our school principal can lawfully ask a person to produce evidence that an animal:

- is trained specifically to assist a person alleviate the effects of a disability (eg seeing eye dogs)
- meets standards of hygiene and behaviour appropriate for a school environment.

We understand that in some circumstances, students may require an assistance animal to attend school to help them to participate in their educational program. Reservoir Views Primary School will consider a request by a student with a disability to allow an assistance animal to attend school with them on a case-by-case basis. If you would like to discuss this further, please contact Steve Stafford, Principal.

Pet dogs

Reservoir Views Primary School is not a public place, and our principal has the authority to permit or decline entry to school grounds and impose conditions of entry.

Whilst Reservoir Views Primary School understands that many families in our school community keep dogs as pets, to ensure that our school remains a safe and inclusive place for everyone, pet dogs are not permitted on school grounds under any circumstances.

Stray dogs

Unaccompanied or stray dogs sighted at our school should be reported immediately to the office. School staff will contact municipal authorities and/or Victoria police for assistance in managing and removing a stray dog from school grounds, and ensure staff and students remain safe at school.

REVIEW PERIOD

This policy was updated on the 1st August 2019 and is scheduled for review in August 2022.
