SCHOOL SWIMMING

Our whole school swimming program starts the day after Queen's Birthday, on Tuesday the 11th of June. Learning to swim and learning about water safety is vitally important for all Australians and is an important focus of the Department of Education's *Swimming in Schools Program*, which supports the delivery of quality swimming and water safety education. The initiative provides funding to ensure all students have the opportunity to:

- learn how to swim
- develop lifelong skills in water safety to reduce their risk of drowning and injury.

'By the end of primary school, it is anticipated that students should be able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills identified in the Victorian Water Safety Certificate. The Certificate is awarded when a student can swim 50m continuously, answer water safety based questions and perform simple rescues.'

THE ENVIRONMENT CLUB

On Tuesday, the Environment Club met for the first time. Cleo, Mini and Chelsea have decided to focus on what we can do at Reservoir Views to eliminate the amount of rubbish heading to landfill. They have chosen to focus on rubbish free lunches and are currently in the process of designing posters that promote why we should try to eliminate rubbish from our lunches.
