ANNUAL REPORT TO COMMUNITY

We have a lot to celebrate with the achievements made in 2018.

The 2018 Performance summary indicates improvements with the Parent Satisfaction Summary and School Staff Survey when compared to 2017.

Teacher judgements of student achievement show great improvements in English and Mathematics. 92% of student at or above age expected level in English. The State median was 90.1%. In Mathematics 90.3% of students achieved at or above expected age level. The State mean was 91.1%.

The NAPLAN Learning Gain Year 3 to Year 5 indicates that more than 25% of students achieved high gains in Reading, Numeracy and Spelling. Writing and Grammar & Punctuation were below 25%. Our focus for 2019 is Writing which will incorporate improving our use of grammar and punctuation conventions.

The average number of days absent is 16.9days which is higher than State Median (15.1).

Students Attitude to School survey results in relation to Sense of Connectedness was 88.9% (positive response agree or strongly agree). This is **higher** than State median (81.1%) and **higher** than similar schools. With regards to management of bullying 92.8% had a positive response, **higher** than State median (81.2%) and **higher** than similar schools.


