SLIGHT CHANGES TO MONDAY ASSEMBLY ARRANGEMENTS

Starting next week, Monday the 13th of May, there will be some very slight changes to our weekly assembly arrangements. Instead of putting bags down outside classrooms and moving independently to the hall when the music plays, all students will now enter the classrooms as other days, put bags away, settle with their classroom teacher and move to the hall for assembly at approximately 9:05am.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2019 for Years 3 and 5 students will be held on Tuesday 14th May, Wednesday 15th May and Thursday 16th May 2019. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals which can be used to improve student achievement.

All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. During test week, catch-up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days. These students may undertake catch-up tests on the days in the test week after the scheduled test, up to and including Friday 17th May 2019. Support can be arranged for students with disabilities, if the student regularly uses similar support for classroom assessment tasks.

Exemptions may be granted to students with significant intellectual disabilities and to students who have been learning English for less than one year.

If your child is eligible for support due to disability or an exemption, you should discuss this with his/her teacher prior to the tests. Parental consent is required before any support due to disability or exemption is granted.

Later in the year parents of Year 3 and 5 students will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. The report will describe your child's particular skills in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to national minimum standards. These describe the minimum acceptable standards for students across Australia.

2019 STUDENT ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY

Reservoir Views Primary School values student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and we are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

At Reservoir Views Primary School we value:

All students from Years 4, 5 and 6 at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose-built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey.

The students will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over a three-week period from Monday 20th May to Friday 7th June. The survey only takes about twenty minutes to complete and occurs during class time.

The survey results will be reported back to the school before the end of term 2. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. The results of the survey will be published in a Newsletter later in the year when they become available.
