Dear Reservoir Views students, families and local community members,

The news we all received on Friday afternoon that we would be entering a statewide lockdown was not what any of us wanted. For many of us it brought up very recent memories of the very challenging 2020 we lived through. I would like to thank all of our community for the support you have given all of our staff during this 'snap' lockdown.

I am so incredibly pleased and relieved that it was just the three days of face-to-face learning that was disrupted.

Over the past three days staff have undertaken a variety of professional learning and have had the opportunity to begin developing *Individual Education Plans* (IEPs) for all students across the school. These plans will consist of a literacy based goal, a numeracy based goal and a personal and social learning based goal. The students will be actively involved in the creation and ongoing tracking of these goals and so will families. They will be 'visible' within the classroom and will focus on strategies that can be used and actions undertaken both at school and at home to achieve these goals. ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Teaching & Learning

All students are bringing home books to read each day. It is very important for children to be reading for 20 minutes every night. This can look very different for everyone. Students may read on their own, with an adult or family member, or the student may be read to. You may read as soon as you get home, after dinner, in a comfortable special place or before you go to bed. Students will bring home books that are 'just right' for them, they should be able to read on their own and understand it. The expectation in that home reading is done for enjoyment and the love of reading.

You can ask questions before, during and at the end of the book such as:

- What do you think this book will be about?
- Why do you think the character did that?
- If you were the main character, what would you do?
- What do you think will happen now?
- If you could write a different ending, what would it be?
- Who would you recommend this book to? Why?

Choose questions that are suited to your child.



Wellbeing

A large part of my role is the wellbeing and health of our students, all students have the right to learn regardless of any disabilities, trauma, physical or mental abilities. I work with our Allied health team to ensure the 'whole child' is catered for. These include but are not limited to speech therapists, support officers, psychologists and other care workers including the 'Program for Students with Disabilities' ensuring inclusivity for all of our students.

LITERACY AND NUMERACY

We have been working on our reading and were surprised with a whole set of new Classroom Library books! We are looking forward to showing you what our Classroom Libraries look like when they are completely set up! The Classroom Library texts are to supplement the decodable texts the students use and provide students with texts they will read in class to build their love of reading and spark their curiosity!

The introduction of the Writer's Notebook caused quite a stir this fortnight in classes! Students were

very enthused to use their creativity to list as many story ideas as they could. Over the coming weeks more information will be going home about the use of 'seeds' to spark ideas for writing and how that will look in 3/4.

In Numeracy we have been revising our number skills through many games and hands on activities. One of the favourites has been a game called 'Headache!' which is built around the skill of subitising and utilises both addition and subtraction facts!



NEW RESPONSIBILITIES

As we move up the school, students are given more rights and responsibilities. One of these is being responsible for the school's recycling and compost. We have been trusted with task of ensuring the school is doing all it can to reduce our carbon footprint with regards to recycling and compost. A few times each week we check in with classes and remove their recycling and compost. The students have enjoyed being trusted with such an important task!








We have been teaching sustainability to the younger students across the school...







Genius Hour allows our 4/5/6 students to work on a passion project, idea or new skill during class time. Genius Hour projects can be completed during a certain learning time on a regular basis.

During Genius Hour, students will identify a topic or problem they are passionate about and form a deep, open-ended inquiry question to research, answer or solve.

In the past few weeks, the 4/5/6 cohort have created a "WONDERWALL" to display their curious wonderings or questions.

Examples of their wonderings include:

- Why do people test chemicals on animals first?
- How did dinosaurs come to life?
- How do motorbikes work?
- Why do we have to wear hats on a cloudy day in summer?

Physical Education


The 3-6 students have been preparing for our upcoming athletics day. They have been working on their high jump, long jump, triple jump, discus, shot put and sprinting skills.
