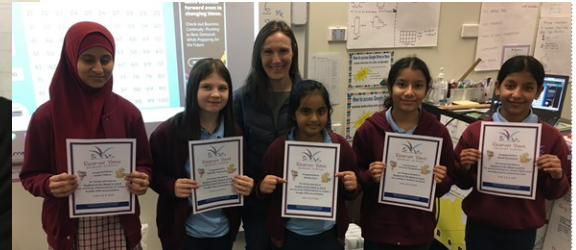
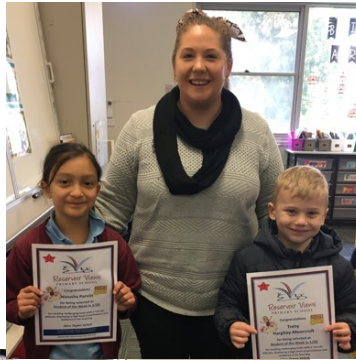

What a term! Again, I would like to thank the entire Reservoir Views Primary School community for our incredible efforts throughout such a challenging, uncertain and disruptive term. We are looking forward to Term 3 having a bit more 'normality' to it.

Unfortunately it seems like we will continue to have restrictions on parents being able to enter the school grounds and we will continue with our staggered pick up times—these times will change slightly with all students in Foundation to Year 2 being picked up at 3:15pm with older siblings and all students in years 3 to 6 being pick up at 3:30pm. We will also continue with opening our gates at 8:30am. I would like to thank all of our families for supporting the staggered pick up times throughout this term.

To celebrate the end of this term we will be having an out of uniform day tomorrow.

SCHOOL PLAYING FIELD

A few weeks ago I received the positive news I have been working towards for the past 7 months—Reservoir Views has received funding for a brand new school sports / playing field.

Our current school sports / playing field lies exactly where the previous buildings of Keon Park Primary School once stood and this land has proved to be less than desirable for a playing field to be established. On Tuesday I met with architects from Haskell Architects to discuss the plan moving forward. Ground investigative works will be taking place over this term break and I am hopeful all works will be completed by the end of this year.

We have received \$750,000—which is a substantial amount of money; there is also a substantial amount of work required but we will end up with a 'real' turf playing field with an irrigation system. We're all very excited! I will keep the community updated with the planned times for any work to be completed.

Our Term 2 Ride/Scout to School Day was another success, even with the morning mist/fog arriving. It was wonderful to see so many of our Foundation students riding and scooting to school.
