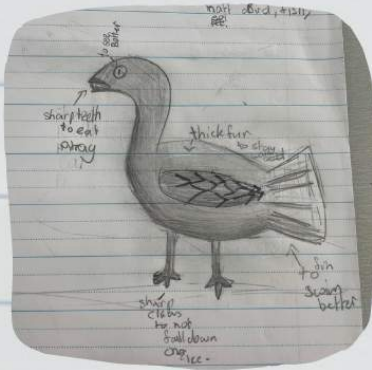
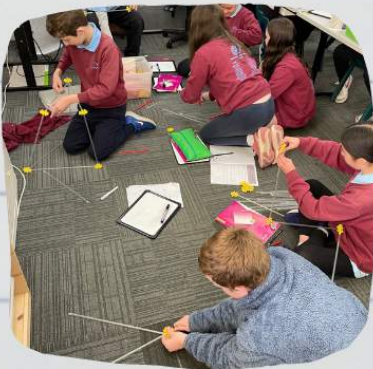
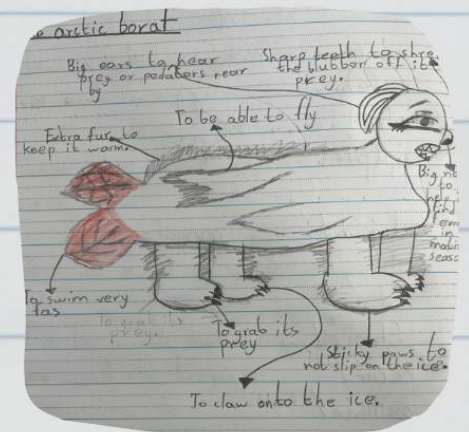

## ANIMAL ADAPTATIONS



In the 5/6 cohort, we studied animal adaptations and how they work. We learned about the silver ant in the desert and how its hard shell reflects sunlight, despite this, the ant can only survive 10 minutes in the midday sun. Throughout this unit we have done many activities that help us explore this concept such as an experiment using butter and ice-cold water to investigate how blubber works we also created our own hybrid animal that could adapt to the colder climates thinking about their structural, behavioral, and physiological adaptations.

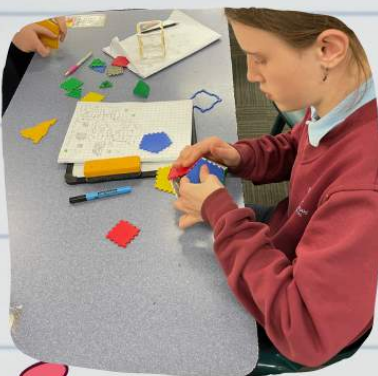

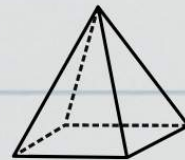

*In Auslan we have been learning different signs for feelings and using our facial expressions and body language to help when signing.*



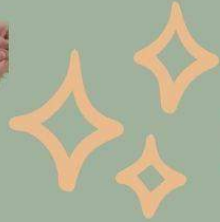
*The students have been using non-manual features like facial expressions and body language in signing Auslan.*

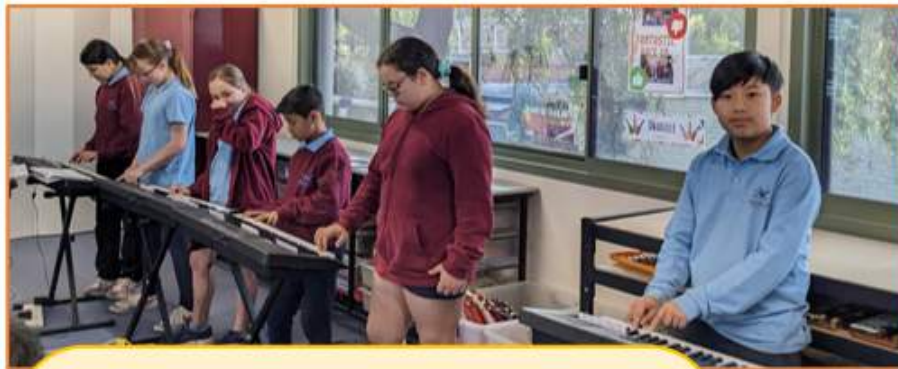
