National Sorry Day - A Time for Reflection and Healing



This Sunday, May 26th, is National Sorry Day. This significant day serves as a poignant reminder of the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, particularly the Stolen Generations, who were forcibly removed from their families and communities.

- **Read and Learn Together:** Explore books, films, and online resources that highlight Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures, and contributions.


Committing to Reconciliation

F/1 NEWS


LITERACY


NUMERACY






In the Classroom

Maths Investigation

2/3/4 students investigated the different numeracy skills that we use during every day tasks like baking biscuits. The skills that we used or observed were doubling, multiplying fractions, measurement in grams, measurement of time and temperature and multiplication using arrays.
