#### **POTATO OLYMPICS**




Who would believe that students could build a personal relationship with a potato?










#### KINDER ON SCHOOL SITES PROGRAM


The funds raised will be used to support the Year 6 graduation and endof-year celebrations. Thank you to everyone who participated and helped make this event a memorable highlight of the school year!

#### Kinders at Schools

#### Frequently asked questions

The Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) is building kindergartens at new and some existing primary schools across Victoria.

Building kinders at schools may make drop-off easier for families and support kids as they transition to school.

January 2024

The Victorian Government is reforming early learning, making it bigger, better and fairer. With new partnerships and record investment, all Victorian children can get 2 years of free kinder.

Over the next decade, Four-Year-Old Kindergarten will become Pre-Prep – doubling children's play-based learning to 30 hours a week. At the same time, the roll-out of Three-Year Old Kindergarten will continue. By 2029, free kindergarten hours for 3-year-olds will increase from 5 to 15 hours a week. We're making sure there are enough kinders to make this possible.

We're building kindergartens at some existing schools and ensuring there's a kinder at, or next to, every new primary school we build.

Building kindergartens at schools provides many benefits for Victorian families, including making:

- kindergarten programs easier to access
- drop-off time simpler and more convenient for some families
- the transition from kindergarten to school smoother for children.

The needs of each area are different. So, we work closely with local government to plan new kindergartens. This ensures the best educational outcomes for children and broader benefits for their families.

#### How do you decide which schools get kindergartens?

We assess schools in areas with significant kinder demand to make sure we build them where they're most needed.

We consider the school's future needs too. Are they under enrolment pressure and might need to expand? Will they have sufficient open space? We also assess street access and parking.

#### How are the kindergartens designed and built?

We work closely with the school and local council throughout planning, design, and construction. This ensures what we build meets the ongoing needs of the school and the kindergarten.

We confirm the exact timing of site works and construction to minimise the impact on the school.

We often use modular construction for kindergartens at schools. Modular buildings are built offsite and craned in so there is less disruption for the school. It also greatly reduces construction time and safety risks.







#### Who will operate the kindergartens?

Local governments play a key role in early childhood education, especially building and managing kindergartens. So, we offer them the first option to operate new kinders.

Councils are also more likely able to support ongoing operations of early childhood services, including maintenance, cleaning, enrolments, staffing and other administration.

They commonly lease kindergartens to third-party kinder providers.

#### What if the local council doesn't want to run the kindergarten?

If the council decides not to be involved, we find an organisation experienced at running kinders.

This process is open to all not-for-profit organisations, including the school. We assess all submissions on their merit.

#### Who can attend the kindergarten, and do they have to enrol in the co-located school?

Any child from the local community can apply to enrol.

Services offering funded kindergarten places are required to give priority access to children identified in the Department's <u>Priority of Access Policy</u>. After offering places to children on the priority list, services may choose to allocate priority to children on whatever basis they choose as stated in their policy. This could be those with a link to the service, proximity to the service or other criteria.

Children who attend the kindergarten do not have to attend prep at the co-located school. Similarly, children who attend the kindergarten are not guaranteed a prep place at the colocated school.

Parents who want their children to transition to the co-located school must formally enrol through the normal departmental processes. Government schools must adhere to the Department's Enrolment Placement Policy.

#### Who is responsible for the kindergarten's operations and costs?

The kinder operator is responsible for all ongoing operational, staffing, and administration costs. These obligations are outlined in their lease with the Department.

#### How will parking and traffic be managed?

We balance site capacity, school needs and onsite car parking as part of the overall kindergarten planning and design.

Where possible and practical, we provide some onsite car parking for the kindergarten.

The local council is responsible for managing traffic outside school boundaries. Our planning discussions with the council include finding the best local traffic and car parking outcomes for the kinder, school and local community.




