Literacy

Language Comprehension

We have been learning lots of new information and vocabulary, about animals, from non-fiction texts.

Phonics

This fortnight we have been decoding CCVC, VCC and CVCC words. Every week we are learning the skills to read more words. It is very exciting.

Writing

Every day we practise handwriting. We are learning to recount the details of events such as our trip to the zoo or the events of the weekend.

Numeracy

Foundation students have been learning about capacity. We used containers of differing size and shape to compare their capacity. We have also been learning about subtraction. We know that when we take some away, the number gets smaller.



Inquiry

It was a big thrill to go on the bus to the Melbourne Zoo. We talked to the zoo teachers and zookeepers about the needs of animals. We are learning about the different animal groups. In other exciting news, our seeds are starting to grow.














INQUIRY



IN THE GARDEN



This is a great time of year to begin thinking ahead about the work to do in the vegetable garden in the coming months. One of jobs in the garden at the moment is making sure we are putting the right things on our compost bins.



One of the keys to a successful compost is layers!

After we put in our fruit and vegetable scraps, it is important to cover these with a dry material, such as straw or shredded paper.

Recipe

It is perfect soup weather, and seeing as we are growing lots of brassicas in the garden, here is just the recipe to match:

BROCCOLI SOUP

2 x Broccoli, diced
2 x Cauliflower, diced
coconut oil
1 x onion, diced
2 stalks of celery
4 cups of vegetable stock
1 can of coconut milk
Mint, parsley & salt to taste

- Heat the oil, celery and onion, cook until translucent.
- 2. Add broccoli, cauliflower and stock bring to a boil.
- 3. Reduce heat, cook for 15 mins.
- Add herbs, salt and coconut milk, then blend.
